3DLife Student Behavior Expectations

First Baptist youth, and their guests, are expected to comply with the following behavioral guidelines. Our attitudes and actions affect one another and the mission of student ministry events.

Adults will hold students to these standards. When compromised, students will be addressed with grace and understanding with a view toward full restoration. Students who are defiant and unrepentant will be returned home early at the expense of their parent(s)/guardian(s).

Illegal activity constitutes immediate dismissal from the event. Severe forms of compromise (see "Refuse Compromise" below) may be grounds for immediate dismissal at the discretion of the lead adult present at the event.

Speak respectfully. Students who have a personal relationship with Christ should bring honor to Him in their speech. Students without such a relationship should still speak respectfully of Him and to one another. Insulting and abusive speech, curse words (and their substitutions -- i.e. "frickin'"), and using the Lord's name in vain will not be tolerated. Students will be encouraged to refrain from such talk and expected to reasonably control it.

Honor adults. Speech and actions that dishonor parents and other adults, present or not, will not be tolerated. Students can honor adults through their attitude, speech and following adult leadership.

Act appropriately. Students should act appropriately for the nature of the event. If it is a "Deliver" event, they are expected to participate and serve. If it is a "Discover" event, they are expected to act so that the group can discover God and his family. If it is a "Develop" event, students are expected to act in such a way that individuals, and the group, can develop toward Christ-likeness without distraction. There is a time and a place for everything. Students should act in ways appropriate for the event.

Refuse compromise. Students participating in student ministry events must refuse compromising behavior such as public displays of affection, being alone with members of the opposite sex, romantic and physical interactions with members of the opposite sex, not being where you are supposed to be, participating in forms of drug use, stealing, fighting, etc.

Dress modestly. When in doubt, wear something more modest. School dress guidelines are a rule of thumb that will be followed. During events including water activities, two piece bathing suits will not be allowed.

Every discipline opportunity is a discipleship opportunity. Adults will seek to teach students through discipline opportunities that arise. Grace will be given. Humility, respect and repentance are expected.

As we follow these basic guidelines, we'll have a great time together Discovering God and His family, Developing self and others, and Delivering purpose and hope! God wants to do amazing things in and through each individual and His church.
